

OBJECTIVE

To clarify that, despite the Florida constitutional amendment legalizing the use of Marijuana for medical purposes and the decriminalization of the possession of small amounts of Marijuana by the City of Orlando, Marijuana is prohibited from being brought onto Airport Property under Federal law and, if found, may be confiscated and subject the person carrying it to criminal charges.

DEFINITIONS

Airport Property: All property under the control of the Greater Orlando Aviation Authority, including both Orlando International Airport and Orlando Executive Airport.

Marijuana: All parts of any plant of the genus Cannabis, whether growing or not; the seeds thereof; the resin extracted from any part of the plant; and every compound, manufacture, salt, derivative, mixture, or preparation of the plant or its seeds or resin including low-THC cannabis, which are dispensed from a medical marijuana treatment center for medical use by qualified patient.

Prohibition: Marijuana is a Schedule 1 controlled substance under Federal law. The possession, consumption, use, display, transfer, distribution, sale, transportation, or growth of Marijuana on Airport Property is prohibited.

Enforcement: Any person violating this provision will be detained or arrested by a Law Enforcement Officer.

NOTICE OF POLICY

The Authority will post this Policy on its website and will post signs advising all persons, including the traveling public, employees of the Authority and employees of any vendors, contractors and consultants of the prohibition of Marijuana on Airport Property and warning that if they are found violating this Policy, they may be detained and/or arrested.
